Course Assignments/1000 points total

- Performance of two monologues, one classical and one contemporary, 100 points each for a **total of 200 points.** (please explore new material)
- One written review (1-3 pages in length) and all discussions of the chapters, 150 points
- Audition Notebook: a binder that holds your audition materials, songs and monologues, in an organized manner and documents your auditions during the semester. For example where you auditioned, the pieces you auditioned with and a description of the audition process as well as the outcome, this should include the New York Showcase if you are involved. **100 points**
- Solo Performance Piece, 10 15 minutes in length that you create and connect with. Material may be original and/or created from other works that you are drawn to. Develop the piece through rehearsal, this in not an improvisation assignment. **250 points**
